IV. Approval of Minutes of April 14, 2015

VI. **New Business**

- 1. Recognize Alpharetta Gymnastics Academy State Champions
- Christine Young, Recreation Coordinator at ACC, who oversees the competitive gymnastics program came to recognize AGA for their recent accomplishments
- AGA is comprised of seven levels, five of which are competitive; two are developmental
- Four levels attended State this past month and many winners emerged from those competitions.

- First team, EXCEL, coached by the program's director and head coach, Ashley Banan, won 10th place out of 35 teams at State; one gymnast, Anna Grace Stewart, won in individual events for Vault and Floor
- Level 4 placed 6th in their competition; coached by Ashley Banan, Sandra Maki and Nina Ogudove
- Level 3 had a great win coming in 2nd at State; all around champions and individual winners on Bars are Ella Thurman and Grace Eneberg; Grace also won Bars & Beam and Ella won on Floor; also coached by Ashley, Sandra and Nina
- Level 2 won "State Champions", coached by Ashely Banan, Mandy Hester, Leah
 Campolong and Nina Ogudova; the team performed flawlessly and scored the highest out of 16 teams to become State Champions
- Level 2 all around champions are Julia Kane and Isabella Young who also won on Vault, Bars and Beam; Isabella also won Floor along with Janeya Butler and Hannah Bishop; Camille Block was also a winner on Beam
- The Commission thanked the team staff, members and parents for all their hard work and dedication

- Discussed painting the planters and checked out the outdoor classroom

- Gearing up for the Sharks team and Pool opening May 23

VIII. Partner Association Reports

1. AYSA - Mrs. Appen

- Elections were held
- Martin Charlton, with AYSA, came before the commission to discuss North Park Batting Cages for Fields 1-4
- AYSA proposes to update and refurbish the existing batting cages on these fields; the cost will be covered by AYSA through their capital improvements reserves.
- They were pleased so see the City refurbished the batting cage on Field 7
- AYSA will fund the project to improve the existing batting cages between Fields 3 & 4 by
 installing a concrete pad and installing new equipment consisting of 2 batting structures
 and 3 soft toss cages to the existing area
- The project will run through contractors contracted through the city; they expect the project to be around \$45,000.
- Mrs. Appen made a motion to approve the North Park batting cages changes as presented. Second by Mr. Long. All in favor. Motion carried

2. AYBA - Mrs. Rand

 No meeting this week but they were able to play 92% of their games even with all the rains

4. NMML – Mrs. Beach

- There was a memorial plaque placed at North Park Miracle League field for Jacob Vinson last Saturday
- May 16th is game 5; May 23 is the end of season awards party
- Busy gearing up for summer camp and activities

5. Ambush – Mr. Mitchell

- Season is over, process of holding tournament games
- Three of the five board members were reelected; no one else wanted the positions
- Advertising for upcoming tryouts Peach Jar has flyers in 23 of 26 schools
- Tryout dates; May 26-28 for U8 Pre-Academy boys and girls, June 2-4 for U14-U19 boys and U14-U18 girls
- Super Y starts in the summer

IX. Park Service Report – Eric Milley

- 1. Wills Park
- T-pads have been poured and hope to have them complete this coming week;
 scheduling more concrete work for Fields A-D
- Scheduling asphalt overlay
- Installing new hitting mats in all batting cages
- Successfully passed another Fulton County Board of Health inspection for the pool
- In the process of hiring seasonal help for all four parks
- The roofing and block sealing project at WPRC is completed
- Working with Choate on several warranty issues at City Center
- 2. Webb Bridge Park
- Getting ready for the annual major sod renovation.
- Irrigation and filling in low areas
- The other two pervious parking lots are going out for bid to recoat as well as other drainage work
- Installing new mats in batting cages
- 3. North Park
- Grinding down some of the uneven concrete areas around fields 1-4
- Continuing to mulch all common areas and remove dead and damaged trees from storms
- Next week staff will start to widen the drainage swell on the Bethany entrance with help from Engineering Department
- 4. Rock Mill Park
- Cleaning up the bio retention ponds along with public works
- Replaced about 40 sections of the board walks in the last 9-10 months
- Plans are to coat those sections middle July to August
- Commissioner Beach thanked Eric and the North Park staff for all their help throughout the year and especially during the recent Kings Ridge 5K run; staff is always willing to help in any situation

X. Equestrian Center – Matt Casey

- Horse show this weekend is Bolshoi Benefit and we are expecting 195 horses; they will also hold a Trainer Certification Clinic on Monday and Tuesday
- Rolling Hills Saddle Club comes in next weekend; Mid-Summer Classic and North Atlanta
 District Club Boy Scout Camp end the month's events
- Added a Rodeo to the July calendar
- Staff has added aggregate to arenas and around the lower show office

- The main item on Monday's Council meeting agenda is the City Center followed by the budget
- Several commission members questioned the \$80,00 for Park Master Plans; Mayor included the development of a master plan for Wills Park which also consists of the possible future relocation of the Equestrian Center as requested by two of the councilmembers
- Councilman Gilvin has not heard from anyone asking that the Equestrian Center be repurposed; he feels repurposing the center is in poor judgment
- Councilman Cross has concerns about batting cages at Wills Park; the association would like covered batting cage; bleachers are needed at Webb Bridge for the soccer field;

repairs are needed at the Greenway; also concerns about Webb Bridge Park drop off at the soccer field
