VI. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Impact Fee Ordinance Eric Graves, Community Development
 - Mr. Graves discussed the city's impact fee program which was recently updated by Council
 - The last update was in 1999; impact fees are fees collected for any new developments and pricing is based on the type and size of the project
 - Funds collected go to Public Safety, Recreation & Parks, Roads and a small percentage to administration

Mr. Graves provided the commissioners information on Recreation & Parks
Capital Improvements program for the next 20 years; impact fees can be used to
help pay for some of the capital improvements outlined in the Recreation & Parks
Master Plan Update 2025

 - The committee met and made a few minor changes to the Athletic Handbook
 - Reviewed the annual Youth Athletic Association Guidelines for 2016; no major changes; annual use agreements will be sent to association reps soon

VIII. PARTNER ASSOCIATION REPORTS

- A. AYSA Mr. Burnett
 - Board is working on their list of recommended capital improvements for FY2017
 - Spring registration began November 5; season starts February 27
 - The program will be actively marketed
 - Board voted to increase spring registration fee by \$25
- B. AYBA Ms. Cherry
 - Scoreboard installation has been delayed a couple of weeks per their request
 - Starting spring registration soon
- C. NAFL Mr. Cherry
 - Wrapping up their season the end of this month; dealing with rainouts
- D. NMML Mrs. Schutt No report
- E. Ambush Mr. Mitchell
 - Bad weather has affected the number of games played this season; to compensate for lost games in the fall, more games will be added to the spring schedule

IX. PARK SERVICES REPORT – ERIC MILLEY

- A. Wills Park
 - Taking applications for full and part-time positions
 - Shingled roofing projects at the park are complete
 - Trim work will be added to the Wacky World restroom along with sealing the blocks
 - Added sod and filled in holes at Mansell House
 - Roofing was completed at the Community Center

 Downey Trees trimmed trees outside the old library; building will be power washed; Tri Scapes will add plantings to beautify the area; staff will paint the railing in the front of the building

B. Webb Bridge Park

- Detention pond has been at a standstill due to rain
- Staff replaced all the boards on the bridge at the entrance to the park
- Septic pump has been repaired at Phase III; restrooms are now open
- Roof repairs were made to the Maintenance shop at Webb Bridge and North Park

C. North Park

- Batting pavilion project is near completion, waiting on turf delivery
- Miracle League drainage project has gone out to bid
- Drainage at Bethany was near completion however rain caused delay and there is need to regrade and hydro seed
- Making and replacing signs for ballfields 1-4
- Checking schedule to find a good time for block sealing at the Adult Activity Center

D. Rock Mill Park

- Busy with trail cleanup from all the rain
- Marconi project is on hold due to the weather
- Cleaning and painting trash can lids

X. RECREATION SERVICE REPORT – LISA CHERRY

- Kim Unger is our new Customer Service Representative at Wills Park Recreation Center; in the process of hiring the part time Special Events Coordinator
- Fall athletic league play is delayed due to weather
- Winter instructional programs began in early November
- Winter youth basketball practices are ongoing; games begin December 5
- Continuing working on the 2016 spring and summer leisure guide; staff is researching ideas for several new programs
- Gym floors will be done during Thanksgiving; Wills Park Recreation Center will be closed that week
- Veteran's Day Breakfast and Veterans Memorial Dedication Ceremony were great

XI. DIRECTOR'S REPORT – MIKE PERRY

 Future use of the old library was discussed at a recent Council workshop; staff has been asked to gather some budget information

- Next week a MOU with the City of Johns Creek will be presented to Council; this
 arrangement would be a mutual waiving of non-resident fees for participants in
 recreational programs including girls softball, lacrosse and baseball
- Working on possible bond which could include the pool, art center, greenway and the community center.

XII. CITY COUNCIL REPORT - COUNCILMAN JIM GILVIN

- Mr. Gilvin is very proud of what we do as a community and feels the agreement with Johns Creek could grow in a strong program for North Fulton; thanks to the staff that helped put this together
- The process of increasing impact fees is dictated by the state
- There was discussion on the potential bond referendum; Council is considering the
 feasibility of this and potential projects; there are some other legislative initiatives
 pertaining to sales tax and road improvements that may affect the timing of the City
 issuing a bond
- The idea of creating an Arts Commission has been suggested to Council by Council Member Mitchell
- Would like for all commissioners to tour the old library
- The Commission's holiday dinner will be held after the December meeting
